Banned Books Week is officially the last week of September, but we are extending it for the entire month.

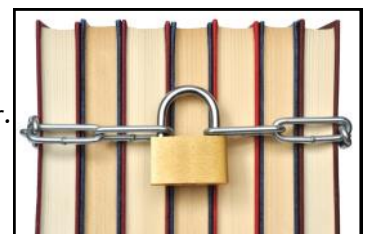
Throughout September, we will have displays and
