## WHAT'S THE PROBLEM?

Power washing releases oil, soap, chemicals, metals, and sediment and can send these harmful substances into our waterways. A little pre-planning can help ensure your project does not contaminate our waterways.

DO NOT ALLOW DIRTY WASH WATER TO ENTER THE STORMWATER SYSTEM





## PLAN AHEAD BEFORE YOU SPRAY.

- Prior to washing: Soak up oil and fluids using absorbents like cat litter, sawdust or sand.
- Prior to washing: Sweep up and dispose of loose debris in the trash.
- Look to see where your dirty wash water will drain to, generally the lowest point on the site.
- Never direct wash water or debris to a gutter or storm drain.
- Pressure washing runoff that is cold and free of chemicals may be directed to a lawn or landscaped area for infiltration into soil.
- For any water that is hot or contains chemicals, use a vacuum recovery system, a wet vacuum, containment pad, or small sump pump to collect wash water and pump to a storage container for later disposal in the sanitary sewer.
