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Commercial Recreation Uses


- Commercial use
- Larger floor area and higher ceilings than other small to medium commercial businesses
- Not many options for locating in Wilsonville

 - Gymnastics and similar studios
 - -Gyms
 - -Indoor playfields
 - Indoor sports courts
